

Learning Help Centers of Charlotte 2020 Summer Enrichment Internship Program for College Students

Who are we? Learning Help Centers of Charlotte (LHCC) is a 501c3 nonprofit established in Charlotte in 2012 to break generational poverty and serve the needs of impoverished families of predominantly refugee and immigrant families. We are affiliated with non-denominational churches who partner with us to serve the local communities in the inner city of Charlotte.

What do we do? LHCC serves families of low-income apartment residents with program services which build happy, healthy communities. Families are predominantly marginalized immigrants and, but include all people groups, without bias or discrimination. Our year-round programs include weekly after-school enrichment, community events, sports, arts and crafts, family stabilization and spiritual enrichment, together with our summer enrichment camp. We invite elementary school children/participants to attend our camp without cost.

Intern Serve Opportunities: We offer students the opportunity to assist in planning and executing our annual summer enrichment camp. Our camp staff hours are scheduled from 9:00 am to 4:00pm Monday through Friday. The morning portion comprises our vacation bible school, education, literacy and reading

curriculum. The afternoons are devoted to fun activities including dance, crafts, swimming and sports, if possible.

Duration: Our summer camp takes place for just one week in 2020 Monday to Friday July 27 to 31. We offer internships for one week in 2020 as we operate under COVID-19 stage 2 conditions.

Skills and experience: No prior experience is required, but it is preferred. Simply, we seek college students with a passion to serve young elementary (and middle) school children of all ethnicities and cultures.

Intern responsibilities include assisting our staff with children's activities, meals, playtime and reading time, coordination of daily excursions, counseling and mentoring, and building relationships with children, parents and volunteers. We communicate in English so that children can learn, however this internship is a rewarding opportunity to converse in Spanish, as well as assist with translation for parents of Spanish students.

What we offer: We offer a rewarding opportunity for high school and college students to exercise their gifts and gain experience in ministry, connect with respectful children and families and build relationships. We also offer compensation (subject to negotiation and based on level of experience and skill set, relative to camp counselors and level of responsibility).
